Meeting called to order at 6:35 by President Deb Marshall.

Officers present:

Paula Wasieczko motioned to accept the October minutes and Cindy Warthling seconded it. The proposed 2026 Budget was presented with increases in the kitchen, website and quilt show. \$400 was put back in the budget for Pink Ribbon. There was no discussion and the proposed budget was passed unanimously.

Program - Joan Rockenbrock discussed glue basting.

First lay your backing, right side down, press well and tack down. You can use Elmer's Washable School glue(watered down $\frac{2}{3}$ glue, $\frac{1}{3}$ water) or Aleene's Tacky Glue. Shake well, then pour on the backing. Spread out with your fingers. Lay batting on top. Let it sit for 20 minutes.(It can be moved, to straighten if necessary). Lather glue all over the batting If there are lumps,swirl with fingers. (All glue disappears when washed). Then lay your top on.Videos are available on YouTube.(Stitched Obsessed is one.) Joan then introduced Denise LaMarca, owner of Aunties Attic, who discussed scrap quilts. She uses Bonnie Hunter's method of using leaders and enders to make scrap quilts, thus creating 2 in 1. She feels the most successful method is "Pick and Pull", by putting your block in a bag and randomly pulling out and using. With this method, color theory doesn't necessarily drive your work. Scrap quilts came about because people wouldn't throw anything out. First you need to decide how to sort your scraps.

A. Size - Determine what is the smallest size you will save. Ex. - 1", 2

½", etc. B. Color - sort by color

C. Planned guilt - It's planned to look as it does.

Remember to always leave your needle in material, presser foot down, when moving machine. Scrap Bag Bash - Use 2 ½"X 4 ½" blocks. Put blocks together, add a border and you have a quilt. DON'T think about color as you're creating.

Bonnie Hunter says don't use anything darker than paper bags for

background. 1. Determine what size you want to use.

- 2. Cut to size
- 3. Background selection has to remain for entire quilt, then pattern becomes readable. The more that's in a quilt, the more you'll be drawn into it. It'll stop you, to look at it. "Extra" from quilt kits can be cut into usable sizes.

She does NOT use foundation for her blocks, unless making strip quilts.

Denise sorts by COLOR.

It comes down to what YOU are comfortable with.(size, color, etc.)

There are no rules in quilting, no quilt police.

90% of people use medium blue, green and violet in their quilts.

Olive is yellow with black added, NOT green.

Christmas Party



Challenge 2025


For the quilters that finished your challenge, make sure the number in your kit is attached to the front of your apron. Please bring your challenge in a plain brown paper bag.

Wheelchair/Walker Bags

Both Wheelchair/Walker bags instructions are listed below. If you have some spare time to make a few. They really don't take much time to make. And the seniors would be happy to receive one.



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SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- 1. Sturdy fabric for front and back such as quilted fabric, denim, corduroy, decorator fabric etc.
- 2. A cotton fabric for the lining, pocket and ties **CUT:**

Cut 2 pieces 8x11" for front and back out of sturdy bag fabric.

Cut 2 pieces 8.5x11" for lining

Cut 1 piece of lining fabric 8x11" for your pocket.

Cut 2 – pieces of lining fabric 2.5×20 " for ties

INSTRUCTIONS:

A. POCKET

Fold the pocket in half right sides together and sew 1/4" seam around three sides, leaving an opening to turn it right side out. Stitch around the pocket leaving a place to turn at bottom. Turn pocket, poke out the corners so it's square. Iron the pocket turning in the opening at the bottom. No need to hand stitch shut as you will sew it to the front of the bag as you will sew it to the front.

B. FRONT

Take the front piece of bag fabric, pin the pocket in place and sew the pocket onto the front piece at the sides and bottom catching in the place where it was turned and leaving the top unstitched. Don't forget to reinforce both sides at top of pocket with extra stitches.

C. Sew a lining piece to the front and back at the top of your bag fabric.

D. Now lay the top and the bottom with right sides together. The bag front & back will be together and the lining pieces will be together. Make sure your seam at the top is laying toward the lining and that sides at seam are matching. Stitch all around the lining and the bag fabric leaving a place for turning in the lining. Trim your corners. Don't trim the seam at the top. Stitch the opening in the lining closed.

E. Now push the lining down into the bag. When in place, the lining should show on the outside of the bag at the very top to make a decorative band around the top of the bag.

F. Fold and stitch the ties to the inside of the bag at the side seams.
