Cheryl distributed bookmarks and posters to members . Have loops on backs of small/miniature quilts.

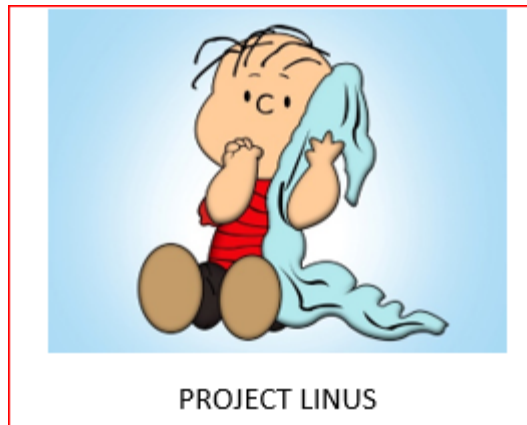
Height limit of large quilts is 90”, so put the top of sleeves at 90” for larger quilts. Wait for the exact height.
